

Abiurana

Durability class Class 1

Specific gravity (1100-)1030- 1170(-1250) kg/m3 at 12% moisture content, fresh 1280 kg/m3.

Colour The colour of Abiurana hardwood is pinkish brown to reddish.

Applications Abiurana wood is used for decking, foundations, hardwood <u>bridge sections</u> and fence posts.

Hardness 12200 N Janka.

Grain Straight to irregular, sometimes with a light cross-thread.

Timber texture Fine.

Workability

Difficult for machine work, due to the presence of silica. However, Abiurana tropical hardwood can

be made very smooth.

Details Faint stripe or flame drawing.

Screwing/nailing Pre-drilling is necessary.

Finishing of surface Want to treat Abiurana? Keep in mind that oil or stain is not directly absorbed by the wood.
