

## Dapalo

<b>Durability class</b>	Moderately durable.
<b>Specific gravity</b>	1000-1100 kg/m <sup>3</sup> . Dried to 12% Moisture content: ± 850 kg/m <sup>3</sup>
<b>Colour</b>	Yellow green brown.
<b>Applications</b>	Dapalo hardwood is mainly used for garden timber like decking and fencing.
<b>Strength class</b>	Unknown.
<b>Hardness</b>	7200-9300N according to Janka
<b>Grain</b>	The grain is straight to sometimes irregular or interlocked.
<b>Timber texture</b>	The texture is medium coarse.
<b>Stability</b>	Moderate
<b>Drying</b>	Drying should be done slowly and with caution, as there is a chance of cracking or warping.
<b>Workability</b>	Machining goes well with Dapalo hardwood and the surface will get nice and smooth.
<b>Details</b>	The heartwood of Dapalo has a beige brown colour with a green shade. Sometimes small black stripes appear. The sapwood is easy to distinguish.
<b>Screwing/nailing</b>	Pre-drilling is recommended.
<b>Finishing of surface</b>	Gluing and finishing are reported to be good.
<b>Botanical name</b>	Buchenavia tetraphylla
<b>Other names</b>	Heavy Tanimbuca, Nargusta .
<b>Family</b>	Combretaceae
