ApplicationsSucupira preto is a very hard type of wood which is very suitable for floors, furniture, stairs, interior and exterior papelling.

Grain Straight, but cross and wavy thread can occur.

Timber texture Moderately coarse to coarse.

Drying Sucupira preto wood dries slowly.

Workability Pretty difficult.

followed by an addition of a colour or characteristic. So in this case 'preta'. For example, Sucupira

Vermelho/Amarelho is a red variant of the wood.
